things happening in our League, and I am proud of where we are today. It is my pleasure to lead you this next year, as we break new ground while sustaining tradition.


# Suds Buds Chairs: Carey Arrington & Lana Zullo

The Suds Buds Project is proud to report that it is successfully continuing to help children affected by poverty in 10 selected Title I and Head Start campuses in Taylor County. The goal of Suds Buds is to provide basic hygiene items which include toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant soap, deodorant, and shampoo to each student. Detergent is also made available to those who need it. These packets will be delivered to the following schools: Locust (Head Start); Woodson (Head Start); Ortiz; Fannin; College Heights; Tye; Reagan; Bowie; Lee; and Long Elementary Schools. This project will help over 5,000 students and their families at the beginning of the school year when the need for assistance is especially great.

The "Packet Assembly and Distribution Day" is scheduled for Saturday, September 19th from 8:30 am to 3 pm (in two overlapping shifts). We will

assemble over 7,000 packets at the Food Bank of Abilene (5505 North 1st) and deliver them to the specific schools. We would like to extend an invitation to all Provisionals, Actives, Sustainers, children who are old enough to participate, and Little Leaguers to help us with this wonderful project.



### Ladies,

In this brief calm before the storm before the tournament begins, I want to take a moment to express my most sincere thanks to you and your Junior League members for what you have done. Please know that you are not only doing an amazing thing for the Robinson family, but you are providing an incredible example of servant leadership for my daughter and every girl that plays in this tournament.

Kris knows the story behind this idea, but others might not...so here it is. My daughter Esther and I were looking at the Wylie Weekly one evening a couple of months ago and were reading about a raffle for Landry. She told me about how she was taking one of her dollars every Friday so she could wear a hat for Landry (a Wylie Elementary fund-raiser) but she wanted to know what else she could do.

I can tell you as a father, at that moment, I felt both pride and helplessness as I looked back at her. All I could come up with was, "Well what are some things you can do?" Esther thought for a moment and said, "I can play softball!"

At first it seemed like what a seven year old might say. Later, I told my wife Megan about the conversation and asked her what she thought about a tournament.

We discussed what a big undertaking that is and how short we were on time. The very next night I spoke to Kris and you know the rest of the story. I still tear up about it. I was overwhelmed by the manner in which your members threw themselves into the task and made it a reality. If you could have seen how proud Esther and Molly Mason were this morning as the Mayor spoke about the tournament before they led the pledge! He commended them for helping others in need at such a young

You have shown these young girls that they can have a voice, that they can make a difference, and that with God and community you can use ANY gift to help your friends...even softball.

As a parent of young girls, that is a priceless gift to give them... just as this benefit is for Landry and her family. I did not know much about the Junior League before this began, but I can assure you, you will always have my support, just call me and I will come. You are class act, top notch role models for young women and girls, and an absolute blessing to this community. This endeavor has already been a success.
