PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

Community Partners

Making a difference in the lives of children is a mission of the Junior League of Abilene. Chairing Community Partners this year has made a difference in my life. This experience, I feel, is bringing me full circle in a lifelong healing process. I was a victim of abuse as a child and have overcome great adversities. When asked to chair this project, I felt what better way to give back to the community which has given me support in aiding in the ongoing healing.

Community Partners is a signature Junior League project. Through this project, the Junior League of Abilene, in collaboration with Community Partners and the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, assists resources and volunteer services for abused and neglected children and their families. One way Junior League assists with resources for abused and neglected children and their families is through the Adopt-A-Caseworker program, which matches CPS caseworkers with community groups to provide goods and services to meet the needs of abused and neglected children and their families. The League adopts four caseworkers each year, providing much-needed funding to meet the needs of families served by these caseworkers.

Additionally, the Bluebonnet Room is a resource for all caseworkers to access in order to meet the physical needs of families. The Bluebonnet Room maintains an inventory of formula, diapers, clothing, cleaning supplies, toys, beds, and other necessities that caseworkers can distribute to the children they serve. The clothing and supplies are changed out twice a year. This year the "change outs" are scheduled for Saturday, October 2, 2011 and Saturday, April 16, 2011 from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM. Please feel free to bring your children and get them involved.

Junior League volunteers also provide assistance with a Fall Festival held for children by Community Partners in October. League members provide candy and help staff the Festival. Junior League members are asked to bring candy to the October general meeting. Also, there will be opportunities to volunteer for the festival on Friday, October 22, 2010. The scheduled times are between 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM, 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM, and 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM. Christmas Carousel always begins the holiday season for the League. What better way to maintain the true spirit of the season than helping a child in need? Starting at Christmas Carousel Rally, Junior League "Santas" will be called upon to provide assistance in purchasing Christmas Gifts for children within the CPS system.

Two new events are also planned for this year. The general membership will be asked to purchase baby items in January for Bluebonnet Room "baby shower." Baby items are needed by the Bluebonnet room year round; so please help Community Partners welcome the New Year baby with a shower. Then in March, a "spring clean" is set up. Don't worry, Community Partners is not asking you to lift a finger. Just bring cleaning supplies to the March meeting and tell your friends that you did your "spring cleaning." Community Partners is a great way to earn your required service hours and involve your entire family in volunteering. It is a great honor for me to serve as this year's chair, and I hope a fun way for you to get involved with this project.

COOK SOMETHING UP WITH

Recipe: *Chicken & Zucchini Spaghetti*

Ingredients: 1 large spaghetti squash, 3 chicken breasts,
3 medium zucchinis, 1 large tomato
Extra Virgin Olive Oil (EVOO)
garlic powder, salt, ground black pepper

Directions: 1. Slice spaghetti squash length-wise and bake in a glass dish (rind side up) at 380 for 40 minutes.
2. Slice zucchini and saute with EVOO, garlic powder, ground black pepper, and a pinch of salt until slices are soft.
3. Grill and slice the chicken breasts (season with garlic powder, salt, and pepper) or purchase the pre-cooked, pre-sliced grilled strips, season, and warm them in the microwave.
4. For the last 3 minutes the zucchini are cooking, slice the tomato and add to the zucchini.
5. When the spaghetti squash is done, remove it from the oven and let it stand for about 10 minutes.
6. Turn the squash halves over. With a fork, remove the seeds from the center of each half. Then use the fork to scrape the inside of the squash to remove the "spaghetti".
7. Toss all ingredients together and enjoy this healthy meal!


